Message from the Gala Chair

Last year set a new all-time high for the number of journalists in detention around the world. The Association Protecting Journalists estimates that incarceration of media workers spiked by 20 percent over the previous year. Iran, China, Myanmar, Turkey and Belarus were the worst offenders in that order

Elsewhere, anger directed at pandemic protocols, plus the economic fallout in Europe from Russia's war of aggression have created ideal conditions for autocrats. They use it as a cover to go after the media.

Journalists are faced with a relatively new threat that knows no boundaries or borders. Online intimidation and violence have reached epidemic proportions for media workers, overwhelmingly for women and especially racialized women. Advice that they should accept violence as part of the job is rejected by these women, who are subjected to a daily bombardment of vile attacks and hatred. Filipino journalist Maria Ressa, winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, at one point tallied 90 death threats an hour toward her. The objective of the trolls is to hound these women out of the public space.

ECNM has joined forces with other organizations to demand support in newsrooms and also legal action for these reporters.

Thank you for your contribution to the work of ECNM. You have provided funds that allow us to help journalists in distress around the world and to buttress efforts to help those who face violence and intimidation. We can't do it without you.

ECNM's Journalists in Distress Fund provides humanitarian assistance to journalists whose lives and well-being are threatened due to their work. Since its creation in 1999, the fund has disbursed over \$300,000 around the world to help journalists and their families obtain emergency necessities like medical care, legal aid and travel to safe countries in times of distress. We also work with our free press partners around the world as part of the international Journalists in Distress Network.



ECNM campaigns for stronger access to the information system in Canada. We actively intervene in legal cases to create better protections for press freedom and free expression in Canada. We advocate for persecuted and murdered media workers around the world and track cases of journalists being arrested or charged about their work.

The Organization

ECNM is a non-profit organization and it relies on the support of individuals and organizations to support journalism and free expression. We have more than forty years of experience advocating for the rights and freedoms of the media, both abroad and in Canada. Since early 2018, ECNM has been managing its operations on a volunteer basis, without full-time staff. ECNM is proud to have a dedicated Board of Directors and active volunteer committees.

Our International Affairs Committee, works to support a free press around the world, highlighting abuses against journalists and advocating for change, while lobbying governments to take action.

Our Canadian Issues Committee actively monitors policy, legal and other developments across the country, in real time, to address matters that pose or may pose a threat to free expression and the interests of journalists and our independent media in all forms.

Our Digital Issues Committee, monitors and responds to the special challenges affecting Canadian media and their audiences that arise from new media and the changing information technology environment. Committee membership will be announced in the near future.

Freedom of Expression Index

Freedom of Expression Index



Canada is ranked 19 out of 180 countries on the 2024 Freedom of Expression Index, remaining in the top 20 but falling five places from the year before.



Of the 180 countries in the 2024 World Press Freedom Index, only 14% are classified as a good place for the media. The remaining 86% are classified as satisfactory, problematic, difficult or very serious situations for the media.



The 10 worst countries for press freedom in the world in 2024 included Syria, Iraq, Cuba, Vietnam, China, Myanmar, Turkmenistan, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Eritrea, and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea

in Depencie

Fin DePencier is a Canadian journalist and documentary producer specializing in international affairs and conflict reporting.

Based in Yerevan, Armenia, DePencier has covered wars and coups in Central Asia, the Caucasus, the Middle East and Eastern Europe. In addition to writing for C2C Journal, his writing has appeared in Palladium and his documentary work has appeared on Zartonk Media, Atlas News and CTV's W5, as well as being widely posted on social media.

In fall 2020 DePencier was enrolled in Ryerson University's Bachelor of Business Management program when war erupted between Armenia and Azerbaijan. He dropped everything and flew into Armenia to document the crisis, which led to a job with locally-based Zartonk Media. After this he filed dispatches from the Lebanese-Syrian border region and investigated an attempted coup in Kazakhstan in which hundreds were killed. In February 2022 DePencier flew into Ukraine just 48 hours before Russia's invasion began and spent the war's most chaotic weeks reporting from in-country.

Celebrating Bravery



Desmond Cole is a Canadian journalist, activist, author, and broadcaster who lives in Toronto, Ontario.

He was previously a columnist for the Toronto Star and has written for The Walrus, NOW Magazine, Torontoist, The Tyee, Toronto Life, and BuzzFeed. Cole's activism has received national attention, specifically on the issues of police carding, racial discrimination, and dismantling systemic racism.

Cole was the subject of a 2017 CBC Television documentary, The Skin We're In and also hosted a radio show on News talk 1010 from 2015 to 2020. His first book, The Skin We're In: A Year of Black Resistance and Power, was released in January 2020 and became the bestselling Canadian book that year.

Srett Forester

Brett Forester is a reporter with CBC Indigenous in Ottawa.

He is a member of the Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation in southern Ontario who previously worked as a journalist with the Aboriginal Peoples Television Network.

Forester's reporting amplifies the voices of Indigenous individuals and communities, allowing them to share their perspectives, experiences, and concerns directly with the public. This helps to challenge stereotypes and misconceptions and promote a more nuanced understanding of Indigenous cultures and experiences. His reporting sheds light on important issues for Indigenous people that don't get enough attention in the mainstream media. By bringing these issues to the forefront, Forester helps to raise public awareness of the issues facing Indigenous communities.





Mansour Shouman is a Canadian-Palestinian journalist documenting humanitarian efforts during the Israel-Hamas war.

As international journalists are prevented from entering the Gaza Strip, people are turning to citizen journalists like Shouman. His ability to speak Arabic & English is one of the factors leading to his decision to return to Palestine to report on the conflict and communicate with the outside world.

Shouman, an engineer with degrees from the University of Calgary and Queen's University, who obtained Canadian citizenship in 2006, relocated to Palestine with his wife and five children from Calgary in 2022. Despite his family's relocation to the UAE, Shouman chose to remain in Gaza to assist in reporting on the situation. In the months that followed, he used social media as a platform to provide daily updates on the conflict, reaching millions of English-speaking individuals. He has reached millions of English speakers through daily social updates and his interviews with CBC, CTV, and Global News.
